MONTENGRO - PRODUCER'S BRIEFING FOR FIRST CONTACT



Introduction: Under Ottoman control beginning in 1496, Montenegro was ruled by bishop princes until it became a secular principality in 1852. In 1918, Montenegro was absorbed by the Kingdom of Serbs, Croats, and Slovenes, which became Yugoslavia in 1929. When the latter dissolved in 1992, Montenegro first federated with Serbia but voted for independence in 2006. Montenegro became an official EU candidate in 2010 and joined NATO in 2017.

Cultural Practices: Conversations in Montenegro may involve more physical touching than in the US, with light touches and taps on the shoulder being common. Montenegrins value politeness, respect, and formality in professional settings. Building personal connections is important, and punctuality is generally appreciated in business contexts. Family bonds are important and celebrating together with large number of people is normal. Start eating your dish when served.

Tipping Guidelines: Service charges are generally not included in restaurants and hotel bills, so a tip of 10% is appreciated. Taxi drivers do not expect tips, but a small gratuity is appropriate.

Climate: Montenegro has a Mediterranean climate along the coast, with hot, dry summers and mild, wet winters. Inland areas have a more continental climate, with cold winters and warm summers, particularly in the mountainous regions.

Religion: Orthodox 72.1%, Muslim 19.1%, Roman Catholic 3.4%, other 5.4%
