

Introduction: North Macedonia gained its independence peacefully from Yugoslavia in 1991 under the name "Macedonia." In 2018, Macedonia signed the Prespa Accord with Greece, agreeing to change its name to the Republic of North Macedonia. The agreement went into force on 12 February 2019. The country became an official candidate for EU membership in 2005.

Cultural Practices: It is expected that people behave more formally and respectfully around their elders. For example, one would refrain from swearing or telling rude jokes. North Macedonians value respect, hospitality, and personal connections. Punctuality is generally appreciated in business interactions, though social interactions can be more relaxed.

Tipping Guidelines: Common practice in restaurants is to round up the bill for a tip, but in finer dining establishments a 10-15% tip is appreciated. For taxis and hotel services, rounding up the bill or leaving a small tip is common practice.

Climate: North Macedonia has a continental climate with hot, dry summers and cold, snowy winters, particularly in the mountainous areas. The western and southwestern parts of the country experience a Mediterranean influence, with milder winters.

Religion: Macedonian Orthodox 64.8%, Muslim 33.3%, other 1.9%
