GERMANY - PRODUCER'S BRIEFING FOR FIRST CONTACT



Introduction: As Europe's largest economy and second most-populous nation (after Russia), Germany is a key member of the continent's economic, political, and defense organizations. Divided after World War II, the decline of the USSR and the end of the Cold War allowed for German reunification in 1990. Since then, Germany has expended considerable funds to bring eastern productivity and wages up to western standards. In January 1999, Germany and 10 other EU countries introduced a common European exchange currency, the euro.

Cultural Practices: Germans value punctuality, efficiency and direct communication. Professional interactions are formal, with a strong emphasis on respect, organization, and clear communication. Handshakes are common, chewing gums with open mouth and while talking is perceived as being rude, as well as interrupting somebody.

Tipping Guidelines: Round up the bill in a restaurant. If the service is particularly good, you may add a few euros and/or leave a 5-10% tip. Tip taxi drivers 5-10% of the total fee. Tip porters 1-2 euros per bag. Leave 1-2 euros for housekeeping per night.

Climate: temperature and marine cool, cloudy, wet winters and summers, occasional warm mountain (Foehn) wind.

Religion: Roman Catholic 24.8%, Protestant 22.6%, Muslim 3.7%, other 5.1%, none 43.8%
